## **MINISTRY AND MISSION**

### **History**

All Saints was founded in 2003 by a group of congregants who had grown dissatisfied at the local Episcopal Church which had become more biblically unorthodox. The new group began meetings in parishioner homes, the local community center, a local Lutheran church, and a local funeral home. In April 2008 the church rented and remodeled a local storefront church and met there for 6 years. Visiting Anglican priests would on occasion provide the congregation with Holy Communion.

In time, the church was brought under the episcopal jurisdiction of the Church of Rwanda. They called a full-time priest in 2008. He served the congregation for 3 years. By 2011 the church had decreased in number from close to 50 to about 21 people. In 2011, Fr. RL Moore was called as pastor. In 2012, the church moved its jurisdiction to the Anglican Diocese of the South. In 2014, with 30 members, the church was able to purchase 3.5 acres and build a church building (as of June 8, 2025, we are debt free!) At present, the church has 49 members with a total of 61 worshipers who attend. The average Sunday attendance last couple of years has been 46 or 47. Fr. Rick has announced that he will retire as of July 1, 2026.

We are a congregation full of life and faith, rooted in the community of a gated retirement village with a population of approximately 17,000 people. Our members bring wisdom, energy, and a deep eagerness to serve, working joyfully for the worship of God, the fellowship of the saints, and the good of the wider community. While there are several churches within the Village, including one Episcopal church and All Saints Anglican Church, our parish draws worshippers not only from within the gates but also from the surrounding areas.

We are open to changing as we grow, but we want to do so in a way that honors our past and remains true to the Gospel and the Anglican Way. We look forward to meeting candidates who want to discern with us, both in terms of their place with us, and of ideas for our next steps as a parish.

### **Anglican Ethos**

We are a traditional church in our liturgy. We use both Worship Rites in the 2019 BCP. We sing traditional hymns as our primary source for praise and contemporary tunes as our congregational responsive music. We offer Morning Prayer groups for men and women on Wednesdays with breakfast following at local restaurants. Most of our members are not cradle Anglicans. Some come from Roman Catholic backgrounds with most being from the broader Evangelical traditions. We have celebrated our common unity around the Gospel and around basic Anglican worship, devotion, and ministry.
